seeks deeper insight but does not ignore the obvious. Discernment gains spiritual understanding and direction from Scripture.

According to Thomas Campbell, The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is a Congregationalist movement that is "Christ Centered," "Biblical," "Free-Thinking," and committed to "the Unity of The Church." "The Church of Jesus Christ on earth is essentially, intentionally, and constitutionally one." Our denominational structure is not hierarchical. We do not have levels of authority/power. We have widening circles of covenant relationship... of "Servant Leadership."

As a region, we affirmed that we are self-governing congregations in covenant relationship and building a consensus toward a shared vision for our mission as a Regional Church. We affirmed that we are Disciples of Christ in South Carolina committed to the strengthening and development of our congregations so that we may serve our neighbors, here...and everywhere (Matthew 22: 36-40).

The Region is involved in the Pro-Reconciling/Anti-Racism Initiative. Rosemary Simmons Brown, Jerome Clark, Betty Turner, Charles Clary, John Hughes and Carol Hughes.

The Regional Conference was held at First Christian Church, Charleston, SC. Rev./Dr. Fred Clarke was the host pastor. The theme was "Greater Things to Come" based on John 14:12 which instructs us to believe and to perform works beyond that which some might think is possible. Reverend Jennifer Long was the keynote speaker. We were blessed to ordain three ministers: Jamel Cobb, Elaine Peppers, and Joseph Powe.

In an effort to ensure transparency and operate effectively, we are consulting with Treasury Services to determine the feasibility of having them handle the financial matters of the region.

The 2021 budget was \$106,400.00. Presently, there are thirty-five congregations in the Region. The 2022 Theme is: Uniting together to build kingdom ministry.
